Dear Parents/Caregivers,

VALUES

Our School Leadership program that the Year 7 students lead continues to be a wonderful program that is helping build a positive ethos across the school. Now that their big Values focus has been implemented, students are leading the further development of Values through Teamwork, Decision Making, Thinking Skills and Cooperation. I commend Chris Ross for his leadership of this program.

I'd like to also thank all those parents and caregivers who provide positive role modelling of our Values for our students and in particular Respect when in the school. Children pay close attention to the adults around them as they grow, and learn how to behave from them. When they observe adults interacting respectfully with each other, they learn what is and is not appropriate. Thank you for your ongoing partnership with the school in this development.

VOLUNTEER TRAINING

Thank you to the 28 parents who have attended Volunteer Training this term. As a school we continue to be very fortunate to have the number of volunteers working in the school that we do. I would encourage any volunteers who have not yet participated in the training to keep your eyes open for training sessions next term. Don't forget that if you are not yet a volunteer and would like to participate in programs you just need to start by undertaking a Criminal History Check through the school that we will pay for. Once this has been finalised we welcome you to work in any number of volunteer opportunities in the school. Please see Nola Chalakas-Stopp in the front office for more details.

All Parents and Caregivers are also reminded to please sign in at the front office if you are volunteering during the day as well as when you need to come and see or pick up your child. This is an expectation of all schools and is necessary so we can monitor who the adults are who are in the school during the day. Your cooperation in this matter helps us keep all students safe.

DROP OFF ZONE SAFETY

I need to remind all parents to be very vigilant and observe all speed restrictions within the drop off zone. During afternoon pick up in particular, there have been a number of near misses recently where cars have driven straight through the crossing with children either on it or waiting. Because it is so busy at this time, cars are parked closely together and this makes it hard for students to see you. Please ensure you keep students safe by driving slowly and stopping whenever students are on or waiting to cross at the crossing in the zone. Thank you for your cooperation.

UNIFORM

HCEPS and the Governing Council have a strong commitment to maintaining our uniform standards. Generally the uniform expectations of the school are followed very well by students. Recently, however, we have begun to notice wearing of makeup, nail polish, fake nails and/or jewellery other than sleepers, studs or a watch. These dress items are not part of our uniform code and do cause unnecessary issues between students for teachers to have to manage when students do not follow the code. We seek the support of families to ensure that children are in appropriate uniform for school each day and thank you for this support.

PLAYGROUNDS UPDATE

We have now confirmed the contractor who will build the rubberised surface under the yellow playground. The actual start date will be determined by the weather, (they need dry days), but it is hoped they will begin next week. The bark from the yellow playground is going to be moved up to the oval playground on the first day. This will also provide a more even coverage in that play area, as well.

What's happening in Science?

The Year 5/6 classes are learning about the 4 states of Matter, Solids, Liquids, Gases and Plasma. We have been talking about how atoms make up everything in the world and how the state of Matter can change because of heating or cooling.

The Year 7 classes are studying Forces and how they work in all our activities. They are currently developing Scientific Investigations using different sizes of balls, model cars, seatbelts, ramps, marble tracks, marbles and playground equipment. These investigations involve the students conducting "fair tests" so that data can be collected and presented as evidence for their prediction. Hopefully they will be presenting their findings to other classes.

Please be advised that we are a Sunsmart OSHC this means that all children attending our service must abide by the Sunsmart requirements which are a legionnaire cap or wide brimmed hat – baseball caps – are not considered Sunsmart and we cannot let children play outside if they have a cap. They will have to stay in the shade only area. The same applies to t/shirts with shoe string straps or bare shoulders – these are not considered Sunsmart. Please also be aware that we have sunscreen at the service but if your child has an allergy or needs to have their own sunscreen can you please label and name it and we will ensure it used by only them.

All children must bring their own drinking bottles – we have filtered water on our premises but children need to bring their own bottles – recess and lunch is required every day unless lunch is provided. Special lunch days are highlighted on the program.

- A Sunsmart hat, recess and lunch and
- Appropriate footwear.

Rail Electrification

stay **safe** around electric rail and respect the wires

Dear Parent or Guardian

RAIL ELECTRIFICATION 'SWITCHED ON' FROM 17 JUNE 2013

South Australia's public transport system is undergoing a major overhaul to transform Adelaide's public transport network into a state-of-the-art modern, sustainable system providing faster, more frequent and efficient services for commuters.

New electric trains are being built for use on our newly electrified Seaford (formerly Noarlunga) and Tonsley lines, and on the Gawler line from Adelaide to Dry Creek.

Our new electric trains will start arriving this month, with the first electric services scheduled to run on the Adelaide to Seaford line early next year. Diesel trains will remain in use from September 2013 when the line reopens and will run from Noarlunga to Adelaide; while extensive testing of the new trains and driver training will be undertaken on the section of track between Seaford and Noarlunga.

On 17 June 2013, electricity to the railway lines between Seaford and Hallett Cove Beach will be switched on, with the rest of the southern network to follow shortly after.

While passenger trains will not be operating until early 2014 from Seaford, overhead wires, their supports and fittings, will be electrified from Seaford to Hallett Cove Beach stations for training and testing.

Overhead wires and attachments within the rail corridor will therefore be dangerous if interfered with, carrying 25,000 volts of electricity. The system is designed, installed and maintained so that ordinary behaviour by the public will not pose a risk of injury. Like overhead wires on stobie poles on our streets, the railway wires are only dangerous if misused, and should be treated as carrying electric current at all times.

The key safety information we would like you to be aware of is as follows:

- The overhead wires and their fittings should be treated as being live and carrying electric current at all times treat them like you would regular powerlines running over the street.
- The overhead wires will supply Adelaide's new electric railcars with 25,000 volts of electricity.

You must keep clear, and keep children clear of all structures within the railway corridor or between fences at all times. The area within the rail corridor should be considered dangerous.

- Trucks need to ensure they do not exceed height limits when crossing under electrified wires.
- Only access stations or cross railway lines via designated overpasses and pedestrian walkways.

We would appreciate it if you went through this important information with your child/children. As with all rail networks, safety is paramount and we appreciate your co-operation in keeping everyone safe around our rail lines, by helping to pass on this important message to others.
