# **Powerful Learning Environments**

Many of you by now would have noticed many subtle transformations that our Early Years teachers are making to classrooms, or, inside learning environments. This year the staff has embarked upon this transformation based upon the inspiration of 2012-2013 Thinker-in-Residence, Carla Rinaldi.





Based upon her paper, "Re-imagining Childhood", many schools have begun to change the way childhood is perceived-firstly from an early childhood perspective then a primary perspective. Indeed, schools in South Australia are beginning to use the inspiration of Carla Rinaldi to transform R-7 classrooms.

At HCEPS we believe that children are competent learners, capable and digital their social natives. and and cultural connections are diverse. This leads us to understand that in our classrooms there may be as many learning styles as there are students. In other words "one size doesn't fit all".



What we are doing fully complements the Mission, Values and Core Business of our school. By changing furniture, displays, and materials we are hoping to create warm environments which will engage all of our children; cause them to wonder, inquire, experiment and learn at every opportunity and in every space.



You. grandparents your and your greatgrandparents were taught the in same traditionally organised classrooms of a desk or table space for every child. While this was excellent for control of over 60 students during the industrial revolution, current research and evidence demonstrates that our school environments need to be so much more than this. In embracing the research and evidence, we

support our students to make choices about the ways they learn and the tools they use to learn. We trust and support them to make the most of the available space to learn in and to make strong choices about who they work with.

The Canteen Menu aims to provide healthy and nutritious food and drinks consistent with the DECD 'Right Bite' Healthy Food & Drink Supply Policy for Schools and Preschools'.

Right Bite uses a colour code GREEN, AMBER and RED to classify food and drink according to their nutritional value.

#### **GREEN** end of the Right Bite Food Spectrum

Food and drinks that fall into, or close to this area of the spectrum are considered to be the most nutritious and healthiest choices.

#### AMBER section of the Food Spectrum

Food and drink in this section of the spectrum are nutritious and so are still good choices, but tend to have some added sugar, salt and/or fat.

# **RED** end of the Food Spectrum

Food and drink that fall into this end of the spectrum are energy dense and nutrient poor and so school canteens no longer sell these items.

All items on the Menu fit into the GREEN and AMBER section of the Right Bite Food Spectrum

#### TO ORDER LUNCH FROM THE CANTEEN

- 1. Write your Child's Name and Room Number on a large paper lunch bag.
- 2. Using the Canteen Menu, choose their lunch.
- 3. Write the items you wish to order onto the bag.
- **4.** Enclose the correct money if possible. For hygiene reasons please wrap the lunch money before placing it in the bag.
- 5. Place the lunch order in the Class Lunch Crate at the start of the day.
- **6.** To request more lunch bags, write "More Bags Please" onto your lunch order bag. (80c for 20)

They will have to stay in the shade only area. The same applies to t/shirts with shoe string straps or bare shoulders – these are not considered sunsmart. Please also be aware that we have sunscreen at the service but if your child has an allergy or needs to have their own sunscreen can you please label and name it and we will ensure it used by only them.

All children must bring their own drinking bottles – we have filtered water on our premises but children need to bring their own bottles – recess and lunch is required every day unless lunch is provided. Special lunch days are highlighted on the program.

On excursions all children must bring at least one drinking bottle.
