Dear Parents/Caregivers,

Searching for that extra difference in teaching and learning is something that our teaching staff does constantly. Being on the leading edge is important. Quite a number of schools, including Hallett Cove East Primary have embarked upon projects that are child-centred, research and evidence based and sustainable in order to empower and engage students in their learning. The Reimagining Childhood Project is one such driver.

Last week I was fortunate to hear Dr Yong Zhao speak to a large audience of school leaders. Dr Zhao is a global educator of the highest standing and while not everyone may agree with what he says, his message is loud and clear.

He contends that today's education system has not changed dramatically over the past 150 years. Its aim was, and still is, to create a middle class society for the industrial age. However this middle class is diminishing as careers, that were once part of it, no longer exist.

53% of university graduates in the U.S.A are either unemployed or under-employed. Australia would have similar statistics. Dr Zhao believes that there are two important questions that all educators today should be asking:

What skills and knowledge can we equip our children with that can't be done overseas?
What skills and knowledge can we give our children that that can't be replaced by machines and computers?

He asserts that our education system should be about CREATING jobs and not looking for jobs. The creative class is where we might look to as, "...creativity today is job security."

On the surface Dr Zhao's assertions may seem quite "left-field" but a number of other high profile global educators parallel his thinking and theory. These include Sir Kenneth Robinson and Lee Crockett.

What these three educators have in common is the strong belief that creativity and child-centred learning is vital in this world of constant change. Below are resource links that you might be interested in further exploring when next on the web.

Jeanne was a woman I admired greatly... not because I knew her well. I did not. Rather, it was her kindness to me which I have never forgotten. The first Sunday I returned to church after my dad died, I sat at the back. I slipped quietly in after the service had begun and surprisingly to

proceeded to bawl my eyes out. Half way through the service, Jeanne came and sat beside me. She didn't say anything... not a word. She just sat beside me and held my hand. That simple, silent gesture was so powerful and precious. It has stayed with me and has never been forgotten.

Jeanne died a fortnight ago and although I never knew her well, I cried lots.
