selling author, Best Stephen Covev, in his book The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People suggests that every project undertaking or should start with the end in mind. Let's face it, unless we have the end result in mind, it's hard to find the finish line.

Parenting expert Michael Grose says that the end goal of parents is redundancy! What he means is that the role of parents is to promote independence in young people. That way they can become confident independent people. Active parenting promotes independence through teaching, explaining and "prodding" young people towards independence.

This is done through

- *Confidence*: facing fears and doing things for themselves
- Competence: using opportunities to develop "self-mastery"
- Creativity: allowing our young people to solve their own problems rather than "rescuing" them
- Character: which is strengthened as young people go through hardship, failure and disappointment demonstrating perseverance.

If our end result is confident independent young people, then we need to allow them to build their confidence by making some of their own decisions, take safe risks in exploring the world around them, and giving them a sense of responsibility through self-help skills. Of course, all this takes time and begins with bit sized tasks according to ages, gifts and abilities. All the while, we keep loving and encouraging them.
