RESPECTING OUR SPORTS COACHES

We are so lucky at HCEPS to have parents who willingly put up their hands and dedicate themselves to enhancing the home-school partnership. One such group is our volunteer sport coaches and managers who willingly give their precious time to enable students to play their chosen sport.

It is therefore incumbent upon all parents who have children playing sport for our school to be ever-mindful and respectful of these coaches. There are two concerns that have been raised with us recently where coaches have not been shown appropriate respect. These include discussions that have been directed towards coaches that have been less than respectful, and, parents not picking up children on time after sport practice, (in one instance as late as 45mins, arriving well after 6pm).

With regard to the latter incidents, it needs to be remembered that school sport cannot be a seen as a child-minding exercise. Parents are expected to attend all matches and if they do not stay for practice, need to arrive to pick up children from practice before practice finishes. If you are going to be late in picking up your child from training please make other arrangements let the coach know and of timely arrangement in a manner. Unfortunately, as this has happened a number of times, the Governing Council has begun discussions about possibly implementing compulsory registration with OSHC as part of seasonal registration in school sports. This would be to ensure coaches are not disadvantaged at the end of practices.

We ask all our parents to please show Respect, Responsibility and Fairness when involved in school sports.
