PREMIER'S BE ACTIVE AND PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGES

On Monday we had a special assembly to present and acknowledge the recipients of medals for the Premier's Be Active and Reading Challenges. We were lucky to have special guest Chris Wigell speak. He is an Australian champion triathlete and talk to students about the importance of sport, fitness and good health as well as having a good education. Chris presented the Be Active Challenge medals and Reading Challenge certificates. This year we have achieved the following results:

It is fantastic that so many students are participating in both these programs.

In the Premier's Be Active challenge, there were 54 Bronze, 60 Silver, 69 Gold and 37 Champions medals awarded. The 37 Champions have participated for 4 years.

In the Premier's Reading Challenge, 260 students participated.

- 48 received a Certificate (1st year participation))
- 36 received a Bronze medal (2nd year)
- 63 received a Silver medal (3rd year)
- 33 received a Gold medal (4th year)
- 32 received a Champion medal (5th year)
- 21 received a Legend medal (6th year)
- 20 received a Hall of Fame medal (7th year)
- 6 received the Reader for Life for 8 years award (Olivia, Jessica, Jacques, Jasmine, Lewis, Lisa)
- 1 received the Reader for Life for 9 years award (Kelly)

Kelly's certificate recognised 9 years in the program which is an outstanding achievement.

VACATION CARE DECEMBER/JANUARY

Suitable Clothing:

We are a Sun-Smart OSHC this means that all children when outside need to have a suitable hat, wide brimmed or legionnaire cap. **Baseball caps** are not acceptable. The same applies to clothing with shoe string straps or bare shoulders – these are not sun-smart. Children will be provided with school t/shirt if not in sunsmart clothing. We have sunscreen at the service but if your child has an allergy or needs to have their own sunscreen can you please label and name it and we will ensure it is used by only them.

Arrival and Departure:

- We are open from 7:00 am – 6:05 pm.
- All children must be signed in and out of the program upon arrival and departure by an authorised adult.

Excursion Days:

On excursion days children must arrive no later than 9:00 am and we aim to return to the school by 3:30pm. We use Willunga Charter Pty Ltd for transport. Please note **NO** spending money

Personal Items:

- All clothing or personal effects must be clearly labelled. No hand held electronics games, mobile phones or mp3 players are to be brought to Vacation Care.
- No responsibility will be taken for non-essential items brought to Vacation Care if they become damaged or lost.

Accounts:

- Accounts will be issued at the end of Vacation Care.
- Payment is required within 14 Days







