EXTERNAL SCHOOL REVIEW

As part of our continuous school improvement we will be involved in an external school review with a review panel. The purpose of external school reviews is to support schools to raise achievement, sustain high performance and provide quality assurance to build public confidence in government schools.

All government schools will be externally reviewed every four years.

The focus of the review is to evaluate school performance. The review panel consists of a review officer and a trained review principal. The review will occur on Monday 13th and Tuesday 14th February.

We will find out the aspects of the school's improvement that have been verified through the review processes as well as the improvements that we need to make in the future.

During the external school review, some students, parents, governing council members and staff will also be invited to provide information to the review panel. More information about this will be provided at the start of 2017.

SALVATION ARMY CHRISTMAS APPEAL FUNDRAISER

PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

On Friday the Specialist teachers will be running the Assembly. During the Assembly we will be presenting and acknowledging the recipients of medals for the Premier's Reading Challenge. This year we have achieved the following results:
284 students completed the Premier's Reading Challenge this year. This included:

- 73 Certificates (1st year Participation)
- 194 Medals
- 15 Hall of Fame (8 years + Participation)
- 2 Hall of Fame (9 years + Participation)

It is fantastic that so many students continue to participate in both program.
