JOEY'S JOURNAL Feat

It is so easy for us to get scared. We can be scared of change, of a

challenge, of a person or animal. Fear in and of itself is not a bad thing. In fact, fear can be very protective and can stop us from getting hurt. The important thing is that we understand the fear that we are feeling and we use it to our benefit.

There is a wonderful quote:

"F-E-A-R has two meanings: 'Forget Everything And Run' or 'Face Everything And Rise.' The choice is yours." Zig Ziglar

We can identify times when we do need to run away from the things that scare us, so that we don't get hurt. And we can identify times when we need to have growth mindset and face a challenge even if it is scary.

However, sometimes we are so caught up in the fear that it is impossible to tell if it is fear that we should listen to or not. In these times it is important to share our fears with someone we trust, maybe a friend or a family member.

I recently read a psychological study about the truth behind 'A problem shared is a problem halved.' The results show that when people talk about their fears, particularly with someone who has experienced the same fears, their fear lessens significantly.

Next time you are scared of something I encourage you to share your fear, and work through it together.


School Banking Information Session
