NATURE PLAY AND STUDENT VOICE

You may have heard your child talking about playing in the "stick" area (around the trees on the edge of the oval where students are enjoying building with sticks), and the "Nature Play" or "bits'n'pieces" area (next to House 5 that now has a mud kitchen and other materials to dig and build). Development of these nature play spaces has been building slowly over the last year but has gained momentum very recently as part of project development

processes within the action plan of the school's Re-Imagining Childhood committee and since receiving school fundraising funds of almost \$12 000. (This is a big thank you to the school community for supporting our fundraising ventures to enable us to do this!)

Research acknowledges positive health, benefits development wellbeing and resulting in happier and less anxious children, these spaces provide them in learning. Research also shows that the number of children who engage with and learn in and about nature and the environment has diminished over recent generations. Nature Play SA has been created and is supporting the development nature-based outdoor learning environments in schools across SA. Our Re-Imagining Childhood core team recently met with a representative from Nature Play SA to give us some ideas of how we can best utilise our school spaces for outdoor learning opportunities for all students across the school.

These spaces need quality teaching and risk/benefit considerations. Our Year 7s have been working alongside teachers to collect data from students across the school about: who uses the areas, how they use them, which materials they would like and what they consider are safe behaviours for these areas. From the feedback, agreements have been developed that highlight respectful and responsible social interactions and use of the resources. The Re-Imagining team is feedback to determine experiential resources can be provided. Over time we are planning a number of different activities to get students,

including buddies, playing and learning together in these areas and developing further spaces around the school.

Developing Nature Play programs across the school fits within a number of the Australian Curriculum capabilities including: Social eq collaboration, teamwork skills, sharing, negotiation and Literacy eq discussion and dialogue, Numeracy including more advanced skills of trading and bartering, Critical and Creative Thinking eg problem solving, planning, testing ideas, intellectual stretch and using imagination.

Nature Play also develops student voice. Students lead their learning in these areas. We are also planning for students to develop observation and feedback skills through working with other students and teachers. We hope they will eventually be able to transfer these skills back into the classroom in curriculum areas such as Mathematics.

Why don't you ask your child if s/he has been in the mud kitchen or stick area today and let her/him tell you about what s/he did!





UNIFORM

It is great to see most students wearing appropriate uniform every day. We are noticing an increasing number of students, however, who are wearing clothes that are not part of our school uniform. If you are unsure of the required uniform, the school's Uniform Policy is in the Parent section on the school website. We do have uniform for sale in the front office (or the second-hand uniform shop on Wednesdays) if you need to buy any uniform or just need some advice.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS ABOUT EARLY ARRIVERS

Recently a number of children have been arriving at school well before 8:30am. School does not officially open until 8:30am and while staff are at school prior to that time, they are involved in planning, preparation and/or meetings inside buildings. The yard duty teacher does not commence supervision until 8:30am when the gates open. (It is not appropriate for children to be supervised in the office by support personnel prior to 8:30am.)

Please note that our OSHC is available every morning from 7:00am as an option for families who have time commitments due to work, should this be required.

headspace and Netflix collaborate to keep young Australians safe and informed before the release of 13 Reasons Why, Season 2

Tuesday 1 May 2018

headspace and global streaming platform Netflix have collaborated ahead of the release of 13 Reasons Why, Season 2 to create safe and informative resources for young people, parents and schools.

Due to the global impact and difficult themes depicted in the first series, **headspace**, the National Youth Mental Health Foundation, is encouraging young Australians and their parents to be safe and informed before watching the show.

headspace CEO Jason Trethowan said *13 Reasons Why* has shone a light on tough and difficult topics, bringing them into mainstream discussions.

"Television shows can provide parents and schools the opportunity to have conversations with young people about important issues which is great, however, there is the potential for these conversations to do more harm than good. Our aim is to ensure that young people, parents and schools are supported and equipped to have constructive conversations about the themes that are depicted in the show," Mr Trethowan said.

headspace Head of Clinical Practice, Vikki Ryall said another key aim was to support young people who may be distressed by the show's content.

"The likelihood that the content will be distressing or triggering for some viewers will depend on their individual life experiences and current circumstances. No two people will take exactly the same meaning or understanding out of the same episode," Ms Ryall said.

"By providing young people with tips on how to watch the show safely and ensuring they know how to seek help we can ensure distressed viewers can be supported."

Three tailored resources have been created to reach as many people as possible. The resource for young people will provide tips on how to safely watch the show, how young people can look after themselves, and how to have helpful conversations with their friends and families.

The resources for parents and schools will provide information on how to have safe conversations about the show and how to respond to each of the difficult and tough themes appropriately.

Netflix have included warnings and help-seeking information before, and at the end, of each episode for this upcoming season of the show. There is also a designated webpage where the resources will be housed along with aa set of videos from the cast addressing issues depicted in the show, and detailed help seeking information for young people.

"While we cannot and would not stop anyone from watching 13 Reasons Why, we can make sure people have access to helpful and safe information, and remind everyone that there is help available if required," Mr Trethowan said.

The tailored resources will be made available on the 13 Reasons Why website – <u>13reasonswhy.info</u> and the **headspace** website - headspace.org.au just prior to the launch of the second season on Friday 18 May 2018.
