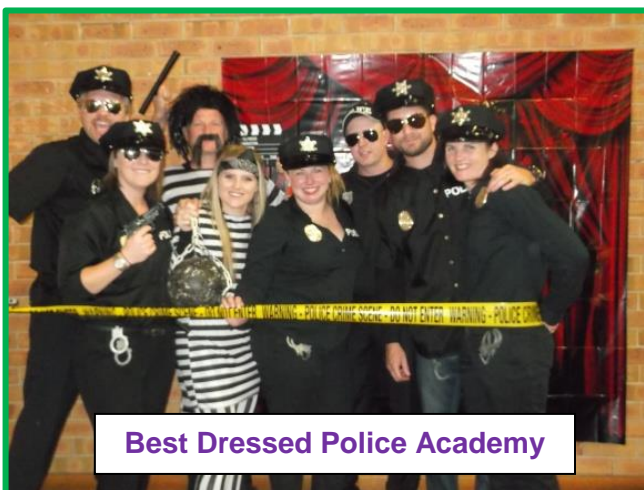
Movie Theme Quiz Night - Wow - what a night!!!

Korner

Hello Hallett Cove Community

There is a quote I love that says, "Life is 10% what happens to you and 90% how you react to it." I've found that to be true: Anything of significance I've accomplished in my life has, at least in part, been due to the attitude I've held, even when there were negative factors working against me that were outside my control.

This is my final week here at Hallett Cove East as Joey is returning after maternity leave. I feel extremely sad to be leaving here, as I've connected on many levels with staff and students.

I have learnt that relationships take time and that there is a lot to unravel when you're working with young adults and how changes in our circumstances can affect us all. I have heard lots of stories about identity issues and independence/boundaries over these last few months and seen significant changes with students in such a short time.

Adolescence is a time of big social changes, emotional changes and changes in relationships. These changes show that

your child is forming an independent identity and learning to be an adult. Young people are busy working out who they are and where they fit in the world. You might notice your child trying out new clothing styles, music, art, friendship groups and so on. Friends, family, media, culture and more shape your child's choices in these years. Your child will probably want more independence about things like how s/he gets to places, how s/he spends her/his time, who s/he spends time with, what s/he spends money on and so on. As your child becomes more independent, it'll probably mean some changes in your family routines and relationships, as well as your child's friendships.

One of the big changes you might notice is that your child wants to spend more time with friends and less time with family.

At the same time, it might seem like you and your child are having more arguments. This is normal, as children seek more independence. It's also because your child is starting to think more abstractly and to question different points of view. On top of this, your child might upset people without meaning to, just because s/he doesn't always understand how her/his words and actions affect other people.

It might help to know that conflict tends to peak in early adolescence and that these changes show that your child is maturing. Even if you feel like you're arguing with your child a lot now, it isn't likely to affect your relationship with your child in the longer term. But it might be a good idea to develop some ways of managing conflict to help you through this stage in your relationship.

I wish you all well and thank you so much for your support this year.

ASBESTOS removal work will be carried out on: **Thursday, 5 July 2018**

From Approximately: **8:00am** until: **5:00pm**

Please note, this date may change due to weather conditions and may occur within one or two working days of this date.

We will be undertaking some demolition work at this property a day or so after the non-friable asbestos has been removed.

The asbestos we remove is encased in a concrete sheet mixture. It normally contains less than 3% asbestos and is only dangerous to health when broken, drilled, sawed or cut.

In 10 Years of Asbestos Removal, the Old Red Brick Company has never had an air monitor reading which has picked up more than 0.01 asbestos fibres in the air – this is less than the detectable reading level.

Air monitoring will be conducted by **Dems Environmental**. If you would like a copy of the **Environmental Report** please contact our office.

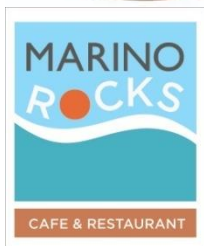
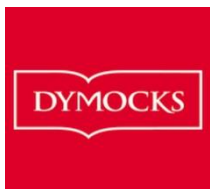
