#### **CLASS VISITS – READING FOCUS**

Over the last few weeks I have greatly enjoyed visiting classes and talking to students about their learning in Reading, (specifically Reading Block which is in lesson 1). I was able to speak to many students during that time asking 3 questions: What are you learning?" "How are you going with Reading?" and "How do you know?" I was very pleased to hear that many students could identify specific strategies they used to help them with reading as well as other skills such as increasing word knowledge and speed of reading. It was also pleasing to hear that most students felt they were going well in reading and could give reasonable reasons such as they were: increasing in speed with less errors, going up quickly in reading levels and feeling more confident. It was also heartening to hear that most students really enjoy reading.

Thank you to parents for hearing your children read at home regularly. This extra practice helps students improve skills more quickly. Several students actually told me that the reason they know they are getting better is that they read a lot at home to Mum or Dad, (so well done to you too!!!) Next term I am going to repeat the process with a focus on Mathematics.

#### HARMONY DAY – THURSDAY 21<sup>st</sup> MARCH

Last Thursday was Harmony Day. Harmony Day is a celebration of our cultural diversity - a day of cultural respect for everyone who calls Australia home. Held every year on March 21<sup>st</sup>, Harmony Day coincides with the United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. The ongoing theme of Harmony Day is 'Everyone belongs'. Harmony Day aims to start a conversation about heritage, culture and community. We celebrated Harmony Day with a range of activities shared with our buddies and peer groups at an Assembly that was held on Friday.
